- Juliette Earley had the highest Jumping Seat score for the Bears with an 81.5 on Fats in Fences

Horsemanship score of 73.25 on Flash led the Western side as the highest score.

 The Bears' next meet is Friday, Oct. 25 in Stillwater against Oklahoma State. Start time will be noon at the Pedigo Hull Equestrian Center.

Football

- Coming off their first bye week, BU prepares to take on Texas Tech in Lubbock at 3 p.m. Saturday.
- The matchup concludes a rugged stretch to the schedule which has featured its opponents combining to go 32-11 and 15-6 in league play.
- Against Big 12 teams, the schedule the first eight weeks has featured a 12-3 record, with three ranked opponents and four of BU's first seven foes ranked or receiving votes in the latest polls.
- Baylor leads the all-time series with Texas Tech, 41-40-1.
 The Bears have won four of the last six meetings with Texas Tech and nine of the last 13 clashes.
- Baylor trails the series in games played in Lubbock, 24-15-1 but are looking to win two straight after a 45-17 rout in 2022.

Men's Golf

- Men's golf went 3-2 at the Big 12 Match Play Championship, before ultimatley finishing second to BYU.
- BU captured wins against No. 2 Arizona State, Colorado and TCU.
- The Bears became one of just three schools to appear in back-to-back championship matches.
- Zach Heffernan went 3-2 on the week improving to 8-2 in his last 10 matches.

Men's Tennis

- Competed at Cowboy Classic in Stillwater from Oct. 11.13
- Overall, BU went 7-4 in singles and 3-3 in doubles
- Freshman Luis Jose Nakamine went undefeated in singles going 3-0 on the weekend facing off against athletes from Oral Roberts, Tulsa, and Oklahoma State.
- Senior Justin Braverman made his fall debut, going 2-4 overall.
- Bears prepare for a big weekend where they host the ITA Texas Regionals where a total of 110 athletes will compete at the Hurd Tennis Center from Oct. 17-22.

Soccer

- Went 1-1 last week, taking down Arizona State 4-0 on Thursday before falling against West Virginia on Sunday.
- In the Bears' 4-0 win over ASU four different Bears scored for the second time this season. It also marks the first time since 2019 the Bears have scored four or more goals in three games in a season.
- Baylor closes the season with three straight road contests, starting this week at BYU and Utah.

- Competing in the ITA DI Texas Regional Championships at TCU's Friedman Tennis Center.
- Liubov Kostenko in singles and the doubles pairing of Cristina Tiglea and Kennedy Gibbs advanced the furthest for the Bears in the main draw, each appearing in the quarterfinals.
- Nanaka Sato plays for the consolation singles draw title on Tuesday
