- Calder's 13 punchouts were the most by a Bear on Opening Day in the StatCrew Era (since 2003).

- Alexis Rutledge earned MOP for Horsemanship with a 75.5 ride to lead all scores in the event.

- The Bears concluded their regular indoor season at the Jarvis Scott Open over the weekend.
- Three program records were shattered, two by Alexis Brown in the 60m (7.14) and long jump (22-3.75) in the span of 15 minutes. Nathaniel Ezekiel broke the third program record, becoming the first Baylor athlete to record a sub-45 time at 44.92 in the men's 400m.
- Baylor takes the week to prepare for the Big 12 Indoor Championships on Feb. 28-Mar. 1.

Softball

- SB went 3-2 at the Getterman Classic, taking down Hofstra three times and falling against No. 3 Oklahoma twice.
- BU is now 6-4 on the season this three of its four losses coming against opponents ranked in the top 10.
- The Bears will be on the road this week to face Nevada, Nebraska, Arkansas, Missouri and UCLA at the Mary Nutter Classic in Palm Springs.

- BU upped its win streak to six in a 66-60
 win over Texas Tech in Lubbock on Saturday
 afternoon. Sarah Andrews broke the Big 12
 Conference record for career games played at
 159 to begin the game and Darianna LittlepageBuggs claimed her 11th double-double of the
 season.
- On the home stretch of the regular season, Baylor heads to Colorado on Wednesday evening at 8 p.m. CT before coming back home to host lowa State on Saturday afternoon at 1:30. The game at Colorado will be streamed on ESPN+ and lowa State's game will be on FOX, the first nationally televised women's game from Foster Pavilion this season.

- Baylor MBB closes down the season series with Arizona in a late-night tip against the No. 13 Wildcats on Big Monday on ESPN.
- BU has won seven of its last nine games with a scheduled tip time of 9 p.m. CT or later and is 12-4 in these late-night games since 2011-12.
- The last time Baylor played a power conferenceteam in the central time zone at 9 p.m. or later was Dec. 2, 2020 when the No. 2 Bears beat No. 5 Illinois 82-69 in the Jimmy V Classic at Bankers Life Field House in Indianapolis, Ind.
