Baseball

- Won its series against Gonzaga to improve to 6-1 on the year.
- Posted back-to-back shutouts for the first time since April 1-2, 2021, after blanking UTSA, 5-0. on Tuesday night and taking the series opener over the Zags, 4-0, on Friday.
- · Junior LHP Ethan Calder was excellent yet again, tossing seven scoreless innings with two strikeouts on Friday against Gonzaga.
- Eight Bears are hitting above .300 through the team's first seven games (Apodaca, Johnson, Jordan, Kemp, Kennett, Little, Riebock, Simmons).
- The Bears round out their season-opening eightgame homestand on Tuesday against SFA, before heading to Arlington to face No. 8 Oregon State, Ohio State and No. 25 Auburn at Globe Life Field this weekend.
