Acrobatics & Tumbling

- Defeated Missouri State to start the road trip, sophomore Payton Washington earned a perfect 10 in her open tumbling pass.
- It was Felecia Mulkey's 100th career Baylor win and continued the Bears' 43-meet winning streak.
- Faces No. 15 Duquesne on Tuesday night in Pittsburgh. The Dukes are in their first season.

Baseball

- Improved to 12-3 after a weekend sweep over LMU.
- This is just the fifth time since 1995 that the Bears have started the year 12-3 or better through 15 games.
- Baylor owns a 2.84 ERA, the 8th best in the country, and boasts many other top-20 pitching marks nationally, including WHIP (1.04, 5th), BB/9 (2.57, 5th), K:BB Ratio (3.47, 14th) and H/9 (6.77, 18th).
- BU hosts Sam Houston on Tuesday night to round out a five-game homestand ahead of Big 12 play beginning this weekend at Kansas.
- The Bears are currently tied for third in the overall Big 12 standings, trailing only 14-1 Kansas and West Virginia.

Equestrian

- No. 9 Equestrian swept through its two tests in South Dakota over the weekend, posting a 14-5 win over S. Dakota State, before topping Minnesota-Crookston 11-3 on Saturday.
- Baylor now awaits seeding for the Big 12 Championships, hosted by TCU at Bear Creek Farms in Burleson Texas, March 28-29.

Indoor Track & Field

- After a third-place showing from the women and a ninth-place finish from the men at Big 12 Championships, wrapping up March 1, the Bears will send several athletes to compete at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships, starting on Friday in Virginia Beach, Va.
- BU's championship 4x400 relay squad, Nathaniel Ezekiel (400m), Demar Francis (200m), Demario Prince (60m hurdles), Molly Haywood & Tenly Kuhn (pole vault), Tiriah Kelly (200m) and Alexis Brown (long jump, 60m) will all compete in Virginia.

Softball

- Softball suffered a series loss over the weekend in its league opener, falling in the final two games of the year to Kansas, which came after a midweek loss at No. 1 Texas.
- The Bears will hit the road for a pair of midweek tests before hosting No. 11 Texas Tech in a three-game set at Gettnerman Stadium.

Women's Golf

- No. 28 WG finished 15th at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate last weekend.
- The Bears saw Baimai Seema finish 41st with an 11-over 224 over the three-day event.
- The Charles Schwab Women's Collegiate is next for BU, set for March 24-25 in Fort Worth.

Women's Basketball

- No. 14 WBB made a strong run to the title game of the 2025 Big 12 Championship last week, posting wins over Iowa State and No. 21 Oklahoma State to advance to face No. 8 TCU, with the Frogs holding off a late BU charge to claim the tourney title.
- Baylor, sitting at a NET ranking of No. 15, now awaits its NCAA Tournament destination, which will be revealed on Sunday.

Men's Basketball

- MBB went 1-1 over the week, posting a key midweek win over TCU in Fort Worth, before narrowly falling vs. No. 3/3 Houston in the regular-season finale on Saturday night at Foster.
- The Bears have earned the No. 7 seed and will face the winner of the No. 10 seeded Kansas State and No. 15 seeded Arizona State matchup, set for Tuesday. Tipoff on Wednesday is set for 6 p.m. on ESPN+. The winner advances to face Texas Tech.

Men's Golf

- MG finished in 11th place in The Cabo Collegiate in Mexico on Sunday-Tuesday of last week.
- The Bears shot even par on the final day of the event and saw Drew Wrightson card a 3-under 68 on Tuesday to finish 33rd.
- BU will hit the road for The Hackler in Myrtle Beach on Sunday-Tuesday of next week.

Men's Tennis

- No. 14 MT posted a doubleheader sweep on Sunday in blustery conditions at the Hurd Tennis Center, taking down No. 31 Cornell in a 4-3 thriller before routing Lehigh in the nightcap, 7-0.
- The Bears will continue their rugged schedule, venturing to Tennis palace Indian Wells, Calif., to face No. 28 Pepperdine on Friday and will then face either No. 17 Princeton or No. 40 Arizona State on Sunday.

Women's Tennis

- No. 20 WT went 1-1 over the week in conference action, seeing a nine-match winning streak snapped with a 5-2 loss at No. 23 UCF, before bouncing back to sweep Houston, 4-0 in the Space City.
- The Bears host Colorado on Friday and No. 14 Texas Tech on Sunday at The Hurd.
