Acrobatics & Tumbling

- Defeated No. 15 Duquesne on the road in the first program meeting between the two, winning by 18.82 points.
- Felecia Mulkey will be honored in-meet on Saturday against No. 8 Iona for her 100th Baylor win, which came against Missouri State on 3/8.
- The Bears are on a 44-meet winning streak.

Baseball

- Coming off a 2-2 week which included a midweek win over Sam Houston and a series finale victory at Kansas on Sunday.
- The Bears erased a five-run deficit to come from behind and defeat Kansas on Sunday, the largest comeback victory of the Mitch Thompson era.
- Heads to Texas State tonight and hosts K-State for its home Big 12 opener.

Equestrian

- Announced as the No. 3 seed for the Big 12 Championship, hosted by TCU in Burleson.
- Competition will take place on Friday and Saturday, March 28-29, at Bear Creek Farms.
- BU finishes the regular-season with a No. 9 ranking from the NCEA.

Track & Field

- TF completed the indoor season at the NCAA Indoor Championship, reeling in two top-25 finishes, women 15th and men 23rd, a National Champion, a National Runner-Up, nine First Team All-Americans and three Second Team All-Americans.
- Alexis Brown made history, becoming the first Baylor athlete (male or female) to become a national champion in the long jump event.
- Brown's historic season was capped off with a gold-winning 22-7.75 mark, breaking the Baylor program record and jumping into the collegiate top-10 all-time records.
- Nathaniel Ezekiel finished as a national runner-up in the men's 400m at 45.44 seconds, finishing just 0.01 seconds behind first.
- TF opens its outdoor season this Saturday at the Clyde Hart Classic.

Softball

- Fell against No. 12 Texas Tech in its three-game series in Waco. The Bears were shutout for just the 4th and 5th times this season.
- Lillie Walker pitched her first-career perfect game against the Red Raiders holding them scoreless for six innings.
- The Bears head in the road to face No. 14 Oklahoma State in a three-game series in Stillwater this weekend.

Women's Golf

- Returns to action on March 24 at the Charles Schwab Women's Collegiate, played at the famed Colonial Country Club in Fort Worth.

Women's Basketball

- Selected for its 23rd overall and 21st consecutive NCAA Tournament Appearance, fourth-seeded Baylor will open the tournament for the first time at Foster Pavilion against the 13 seed Grand Canyon at 2:30 p.m. on Friday.
- 21 straight appearances in the Big Dance is bumped up the third-longest active streak in the nation behind Tennessee's 43 and UConn's 36, jumping Stanford's streak that was broken at 36.
- With a win on Friday, BU will advance to play the winner of Ole Miss and Ball State.

Men's Basketball

- No. 9 seed Baylor will open it's school-record sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance against No. 8 Seed Mississippi State at 11:15 a.m. CT on CBS.
- Baylor is 9-4 all-time with six-straight wins in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.
- The Bears are one of just four teams to win at least one NCAA Tournament game in each of the last five tournaments, joining Gonzaga, Houston and Kansas.
- BU is 1 of 8 teams to appear in nine of the last 10 tournaments, joining Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, North Carolina and Purdue.
- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 13-consecutive postseason appearances, the nations fifth-longest active streak.

Men's Golf

- Enters Tuesday in fourth place at the General Hackler Championship.
- Davis Ovard and Zach Heffernan are spearheading the Bears' efforts sitting in the top-10 as play nears completion Tuesday.

Men's Tennis

- MT went 1-1 at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden at the UTR Sports College Championships at the BNP Paribas Open.
- Bears grabbed a ranked win against #28 Pepperdine in a nailbiter 4-3 clinch win.
- Baylor will rematch ASU in its first conference match of the season on Friday night at 6 pm at the Hurd Tennis Center.

Women's Tennis

- Baylor went 1-1 in the weekend slate at the Hurd Tennis Center, pulling off a comeback against the Colorado Buffaloes before falling to the 14th-ranked Texas Tech Lady Raiders.
- In a big weekend for freshmen, Wenfei Yu fought back to force a third set and clinch the match over the Buffs, while Na Dong extended her singles win streak to seven matches.
- BU is back on the road, facing Iowa State in men on Friday and Kansas in Lawrence on Sunday.
