STORY LINES

STARTING FIVE

- Baylor faces its first road test at UNLV on Friday night, entering the game with a 3-1 record in road openers in the Nicki Collen era (wins at: UT-Arlington, OU, SMU; loss at: Oregon)
- The Bears picked up a big top 10 win over No. 7 Duke in the season opener, the program's first since 2023 and fifth under head coach **Nicki Collen**.
- Baylor returns to the court with a new-look roster that features six new players and three new coaches, highlighted by three Auburn pickups: Assoc. HC **Johnnie Harris**, redshirt sophomore **Taliah Scott** and sophomore **Yuting Deng**.
- Baylor is ranked seventh in the AP Poll and 14th in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll after their 2-0 start to the season.
- It is Baylor's first time in the national top 10 rankings since January 2024 and the 22nd addition featuring Baylor in the top 10 under Collen, 311th in program history.

SHARP SHOOTER

- Taliah Scott** has made an immediate impact for the Bears, scoring 55 points in just two games, including 24 against No. 7 Duke.
- Scott scored 12 points in the fourth quarter to lift the Bears over the Blue Devils, going 3-of-6 from the floor in that frame while adding six clutch free throws.
- The Florida native is shooting 47.1% from the field, 41.2% from beyond the arc, and 87.5% from the free-throw line through her first two games.
- Scott earned Big 12 Player of the Week and USBWA National Player of the Week honors for her performances.

NEW SEASON, NEW SQUAD

- Nicki Collen** welcomed six newcomers to the team after losing seven players following the 2024-25 campaign (six graduates, one transfer).
- Baylor returns just 30% of its scoring from last season, with **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** leading all returners with 385 points (46% of returning offense).

Collen's year-after-year scoring percentage returning:

22-33: 57% > 23-24: 56% > 24-25: 80% > 25-26: 30%

- 529 of Baylor's 685 assists were also lost, with Jada Walker and Sarah Andrews claiming 373 combined. Walker's 170 were the seventh-most single-season assists in program history.
- Hopes are high for Auburn's **Taliah Scott**, who owns 503 points across 23 games and comes into the season as a redshirt sophomore.
- Yuting Deng** also transferred from Auburn, playing in 12 games last year with eight starts and 142 points.
- SMU's **Ella Brow** was sidelined much of the last two seasons, only playing 15 combined games in the last two years, but earned AAC All-Freshman Team honors after her introductory campaign.
- Kiersten Johnson** spent three seasons at Oklahoma, having her career-best day against none other than the Baylor Bears, scoring 20 points in a Feb. 14, 2024, matchup in Norman.
- The lone true-freshman is **Marcayla Johnson**, coming from Tulsa, Okla., ranked as the No. 41 player by espnW's HoopGurlz Class of 2025.

...AND DON'T FORGET ABOUT THE COACHES

- Nicki Collen** also welcomed three new coaches to the mix during the offseason.
- Johnnie Harris** came to Baylor after a head coaching stint at Auburn. Harris was an associate head coach on Vic Shaefer's staff at Texas and Mississippi State, making it to the NCAA title game with the Bulldogs in back-to-back 2017 and 2018 seasons while winning WBCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018. Harris won a national championship with Texas A&M (2011) and advanced to four Sweet 16 appearances with the Aggies.
- Jaelyn Richard Harris** arrives in Waco after two seasons at Omaha, one season at Gulf Coast State College and a playing career at LSU.
- Tez Dumars** also joined the assistant coaching ranks, coming from stops at Louisiana Tech, North Texas and West Texas A&M, but spent the 2024-25 season at Kansas State as a graduate assistant manager under long-time Baylor men's associate head coach Jerome Tang.

FOURTH YEAR LEADERSHIP

- Baylor's roster features four players in their fourth season under head coach **Nicki Collen**, the most among Big 12 programs. BYU follows with two, while Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech each have one.
- UConn leads major basketball conferences (Power Four + Big East) with five returners in at least their fourth year, while Baylor's four are tied for second with Iowa, Minnesota and Washington.

STORY LINES

- **Kyla Abraham, Bella Fontleroy and Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** all signed straight out of high school in an unbroken 2022 recruiting class.
- **Jana Van Gytenbeek** missed Year No. 3 at BU because of injury, but regained a year of eligibility to finish out her collegiate career under Collen.

LIONS & TIGERS & BEARS, OH MY!

- Baylor stayed perfect in home openers since 1992 in its 13-point win over Lindenwood.
- The offense got strong contributions from a 20-point duo: Taliah Scott poured in 29 points on 9-of-16 shooting, including five 3-pointers, while adding three rebounds and three assists. Meanwhile, Bella Fontleroy scored 26 points, grabbed eight rebounds, hit 9-of-15 from the field and made four 3-pointers.

OUI CAME, OUI SAW, OUI CONQUERED

- Baylor picked up its first top 10 win since December 2023 in the season opener against No. 7 Duke, 58-53, at Adidas Arena in Paris, France. The game marked the season's first ranked-vs.-ranked matchup and first nationally televised broadcast.
- With the victory, the Bears are 22-21 against AP Top 25 teams in the Nicki Collen era, including a 5-9 mark against top 10 opponents, breaking a six-game top 10 loss streak that began on Jan. 22, 2024, against Kansas State.
- The win marked BU's second top 10 season-opening victory since 2000, the first coming against No. 8 Georgia in 2005.
- The Bears are the first DI team this century to open a season with a win over an AP top-10 opponent while holding them to 30.0 percent or lower shooting from the field.
- Darianna Littlepage-Buggs opened the season with her 30th career double-double, while Taliah Scott's Baylor debut featured 24 points, 12 of them in the fourth quarter, to help the Bears pull away and seal the win.
- Baylor's defense held Duke to just 29.0% (20-63) from the floor, the Blue Devils' worst shooting performance since going 23.5 percent at No. 19 North Carolina in January.

EXHIBITION AGAINST THE LADY BUFFS

- Baylor defeated West Texas A&M, 86-46, on a stormy afternoon at the Paul and Alejandra Foster Pavilion.
- After winning the tipoff, Oklahoma transfer **Kiersten Johnson** scored the first points for Baylor, unofficially opening the season with a chance at a three-point play just 11 seconds in. The Bear defense started just as strong, holding the Lady Buffs scoreless for more than four minutes to open the game.
- **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** led the way early with 11 first-half points and eight rebounds, helping the Bears take a 33-15 lead into the break.
- The Bears broke the game open in the third, fueled by Auburn transfer **Taliah Scott's** 14-point quarter, going 5 of 10 from the floor with a 3-pointer on her way to 18 points on the night.
- Baylor's 11-0 run in the final minutes sealed the game, with five total players finishing in double figures.
- **Johnson** (14 points, 11 rebounds) and **Littlepage-Buggs** (14 points, 14 rebounds) joined **Jana Van Gytenbeek** (11 points, 10 assists) in recording double-doubles, marking Van Gytenbeek's return from a season-ending injury in last year's opener. **Bella Fontleroy** joined Scott and the double-double trio, finishing with 12 points.

PRESEASON PRAISE

- Baylor was picked to finish third in the league by the Big 12 head coaches with two first-place votes.
- **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** had her second preseason mention come unanimously, joined by **Bella Fontleroy** as BU representatives.
- The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA picked **Taliah Scott** (Ann Meyers-Drysdale - Shooting Guard), **Fontleroy** (Cheryl Miller - Small Forward) and **Littlepage-Buggs** (Katrina McClain - Power Forward) to be on their preseason Starting Five watchlists, joining the top 20 position players in the country. Top 10 midseason and final five postseason announcements will follow for each award, with the winner being announced at the WBCA convention.
- **Littlepage-Buggs** was also announced as part of the 2025-26 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year Watch List Presented by AXIA Time and recieved a vote for AP Preseason All-America.

NOTHING IS WITHERING IN WACO

- Baylor WBB leads the Big 12 Conference with the most wins since Nicki Collen took the head coaching position on May 5, 2021.

- During this stretch, Baylor extended its streak of 20-win seasons to 25 straight years, the second-longest active run in the nation behind UConn, and remained second only to UConn with 21 consecutive NCAA tournaments featuring at least one win.

IDK ABOUT YOU, BUT WE'RE FEELING 22

- Baylor's No. 16 ranking in the AP's Preseason Poll release was the 22nd consecutive preseason mention, 25th overall, dating back to the national championship-winning season that had Baylor at No. 8 to tip off the 2004-05 season.
 - In the 50 years of the AP Poll, the Bears have been ranked No. 1 47 times with the last top-5 ranking coming in 2023-24.
 - Those 47 rankings at the top are sixth in the nation, behind UConn, Tennessee, South Carolina, Louisiana Tech and Texas.

- **Bella Fontleroy** is 26 points away from 1,000 career.

BROW, A KAY YOW SERVANT LEADER

- **Ella Brow** was awarded the Kay Yow Servant Leader Award in its second season.
- The award honors student-athletes of great character who put the needs of others before their own, who uplift others and who do it with grace and humility. They are nominated by their coach and exemplify Coach Yow's spirit to reflect her resolve, grace, generosity and servant's heart.
- Brow joined **Jana Van Gytenbeek** as the second-straight Bear to be honored.

- Arena in Fort Worth, as part of the inaugural Sprouts Farmers Market espnW Women's Basketball Invitational.
- The game will be live on ABC with tipoff scheduled for noon CT.
- The 112th meeting between the Longhorns and the Bears continues the streak of the I-35 rivals clashing in each of the last 50 years, last facing off on February 1, 2024, at Foster Pavilion. Since 1975, the two programs saw each other at least twice each season until 2024-25, Texas' debut in the Southeastern Conference.

WINNING WAYS

- Baylor athletics is in the midst of a historic run of success, including national and conference titles in men's and women's basketball, and football coming off a Big 12 Conference Championship in 2021 and the 2022 Sugar Bowl.
 - Since 2011, and as of the end of the 2024-25 athletics season, no other school can compete with Baylor's run, as the Bears lead the nation in wins combined among football, and men's and women's basketball. Baylor has 32 more wins than the next closest school, UConn. The next closest in the Big 12 is BYU, who has 732 wins, 150 shy of Baylor despite playing as an independent until the 2023 season.

FRESH THREADS

- Baylor debuted new uniforms for the 2025 NCAA Tournament in collaboration with Nike.
- BU was one of three programs with the updated postseason look, joining UConn and Stanford, one of two in the NCAA Tournament.
- The updated Dri-FIT ADV material features an embedded vertical design that was first used with Team USA at the Paris Olympics, as both American squads brought home the gold medal.
- The white home kit features the BEAR wordmark with green piping. A green and gold stripe runs down both sides of the uniform, broken up by a bear claw tear. The green set highlights the BAYLOR wordmark across the chest with gold piping and a similar stripe down the side.

COMING TO A SCREEN NEAR YOU

- Baylor was selected for 10 national broadcasts in the 2025-26 regular season, starting and ending the season live on ESPN.
- In non-conference play, games against Duke (ESPN), UNLV (CBS Sports Network), Iowa (ESPN2) and Texas (ABC) will be broadcast live nationwide.
- In conference play, the Bears will be broadcast at Iowa State (ESPN2), at West Virginia (ESPN/ESPN2), vs Arizona State (FS1), vs TCU (ESPN), vs Kansas State (ESPN2) and at TCU (ESPN).
- All additional regular-season games can be streamed live on ESPN+.

STORY LINES

100 WINS FOR CNC

- Head coach Nicki Collen earned her 100th win as a head coach in BU's quarterfinal bout against Iowa State in the 2025 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.
- Getting win No. 100 in 134 games is the fastest of any head coach in Baylor WBB history in the NCAA era.
- Kim Mulkey achieved the 100-win feat in 136 games, Pam Bowers hit 100 wins in 211 games and Sonja Hogg's career at BU ended with 83 wins. Olga Fallen, Baylor's first head coach in AIAW play hit 100 wins in 131 games.

HEAD COACH NICKI COLLEN • 5TH SEASON



Nicki Collen was introduced as the fifth Head Coach in Baylor women's basketball history on May 5, 2021, and received a contract extension to 2023 that was announced in July of 2024. She enters her fifth season at the helm in 2025-26.

In her first season with the Bears, Collen recorded the most wins by a rookie head coach in the country with 28. She helped lead the Bears to their 12th-straight Big 12 regular-season title and their 11th-straight top-two seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Collen implemented her system, which featured more perimeter shooting. Baylor went from the bottom of the list nationally to just outside the top 50 in 3-pointers made. In her first season, the Bears set new program records for 3-pointers made (233) and attempted (678).

From her introductory press conference, the Naismith Coach of the Year semifinalist said the Bears would be playing their best basketball late in the season, and she was right. Baylor became the first team to defeat a ranked opponent twice in a three-day span since 1999 when the Bears downed Texas two times to open the month of February. Two weeks later, exactly a month after sitting at the bottom of the conference standings with an 0-2 record, BU was back atop the league's leaderboard.

Collen implemented the 1-0 mentality that paid off with a 25-point win at No. 8 Iowa State in front of a nearly soldout crowd of 13,000 raucous fans which clinched the conference crown. Baylor became the first team since Texas Tech in 2000 to start a Big 12 season 0-2 and go on to win the league.

After her first season ended in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Collen saw three of her players be selected in the 2022 WNBA Draft, tying a program record. Two of them - NaLyssa Smith (No. 2) and Queen Egbo (No. 10) marked the first duo to be taken in the top 10 in program history.

Collen's first recruiting class was ranked No. 9 nationally by ESPN HoopGurlz.

In year two, Collen mentored two all-conference selection, two unanimous Big 12 All-Freshman Team picks and the unanimous Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Darianna Littlepage-Buggs. Littlepage-Buggs earned eight Big 12 Freshman of the Week awards during the 2022-23 campaign, becoming the first BU rookie to earn it eight-or-more times in program history. Additionally, she ranked second in the Big 12 all-time in freshman of the week honors.

The Bears secured 20 wins for the 23rd-straight year, which is the second-longest active streak among Division I programs behind UConn's 30-straight 20-plus win seasons. Collen led Baylor to its 19th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2022-23 and 21st overall, as the Bears erased an 18-point deficit to win their opening-round game against Alabama.

Collen's Bears ended year three with a trip to the Sweet 16, highlighted by seven wins over AP-ranked opponents, the most among Big 12 programs. At the beginning of the 2023-24 season, the Bears compiled the second-best start in program history, behind only 2012's 40-0 season, totaling 14-straight non-conference wins. BU then opened the new Foster Pavilion on Jan. 3, 2024, with a strong 71-50 defeat of then-No. 23 TCU in the first conference game of the season.

The 2024-25 season featured runner-up finishes for the Bears in both the Big 12 regular season and the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. Collen notched her 100th win in just 134 games as head coach, the fastest to reach the milestone in Baylor's NCAA era. BU led the conference in rebounds per game, powered by a standout season from Darianna Littlepage-Buggs, who earned WBCA Honorable Mention All-America honors and was the only player in the league to average a double-double.

At the conclusion of the 24-25 slate, six Bears combined for seven All-Big 12 honors. Littlepage-Buggs was named to the First Team, while Sarah Andrews and Aaronette Vonleh earned

Second Team recognition. Yaya Felder was Sixth Player of the Year, and Bella Fontleroy landed on the All-Defensive Team while joining Jada Walker in receiving All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors.

Collen came to Baylor from the WNBA's Atlanta franchise, where she spent the last three seasons at the helm for the Dream. Her rookie season in Atlanta resulted in a 23-11 season in 2018, where she earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors and helped the franchise to the WNBA Playoff Semifinals.

Prior to her arrival in Atlanta, she spent two seasons under former head coach Curt Miller of the Connecticut Sun, helping the franchise improve from fifth in the East Division to second from 2016 to 2017, respectively.

Collen's collegiate coaching career spanned for nine seasons prior to her WNBA arrival. She spent two seasons as an assistant at Colorado State from 2000-2002, one season at Ball State from 2002-2003, one at Louisville from 2003-2004, three at Arkansas from 2011-2014 and two at Florida Gulf Coast from 2014-2016.

Her teams' combined record in nine seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant was 214-74, good for a .743 win percentage. As an assistant, Collen guided four different squads to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the second round in three of those seasons.

She spent six of her nine seasons as an assistant under her husband, Tom Collen's head-coaching tenures at Colorado State, Louisville and Arkansas. She also disciplined under Tracy Roller at Ball State and Karl Smesko at Florida Gulf Coast. Collen helped the FGCU program to a 64-9 record and the school's first NCAA Tournament win in her two-year tenure.

In her nine seasons at the collegiate level, Collen coached three All-Americans and saw three players selected in the WNBA Draft.

Collen's collegiate playing career began at Purdue in 1993-94, when the Boilermakers made an NCAA Final Four run with a 29-5 overall record and a 16-2 mark in the Big Ten. Her sophomore season, Purdue made another deep run with an Elite Eight appearance to go with a 24-8 overall record. She transferred to Marquette, where she tallied 421 assists in her final two seasons, averaging 7.0 per game in her last 60 collegiate games. She helped the Golden Eagles to two-straight NCAA Tournament appearances in 1997 and 1998.

Nicki and her husband Tom have three children, Connor, Reese and Logan.

PAUL AND ALEJANDRA FOSTER PAVILION



The Paul and Alejandra Foster Pavilion along with the Jay & Jenny Allison Development Center is the new home for Baylor's championship-winning Men's and Women's Basketball teams, having played 35 seasons inside the historic Ferrell Center. The Pavilion is a state-of-the-art contemporary field house seating 7,500 fans, located along the banks of the Brazos River on the west side of Interstate 35. Inside, fans are closer to the court to create a true home court advantage.

The Foster's location on the banks of the Brazos allows for the community to be a part of the building's foundation. As a stop on the Riverwalk, the pavilion will be woven into the established traditions of the Waco community. Our fans can enjoy time at local businesses before taking in a game. Just across the interstate from the new Mark & Paula Hurd Welcome Center, this transformative building bolsters the Baylor campus landscape.

The benefit of the new pavilion seating is a more dynamic fan experience. At a capacity of 7,500, fans feel closer to the action and make a dynamic impact on the competition. The new elevation will allow fans to directly access their seat from the concourse, whether you are in premium or standard seating. Fans with premium seating will have access to the Courtside or Sideline Club. The Foster Pavilion will house an exclusive premium entrance, unique to those with premium seating. The Courtside Club is reserved for Champions Row ticket holders. The Sideline Club is located underneath the Club and Loft seats.

The concourse will feature new concession opportunities as well as unique vendor activations. Fans will be welcomed by an energetic atmosphere, cultivated by both the Baylor and Waco communities.

The project scope of the Foster Pavilion & Development Center includes:

- A 223,547-square-foot facility
- Capacity for 7,500 fans including standing-room-only areas for approximately 500 spectators
- Two separate premium club spaces at a combined 8,500 square feet
- Two 2,000-square-foot video end boards
- Visiting locker rooms with the flexibility to accommodate two to four teams
- The Jay & Jenny Allison Development Center for Baylor's championship women's and men's basketball teams, including:
 - Private entrance and elevator, separate practice courts, dedicated locker rooms and team lounges
 - Office facilities for each coach and administration
 - Shared sports performance-related spaces, including strength and conditioning, athletic training/treatment, hydrotherapy, nutrition and more
- Enhancements for the arena to support additional events, such as concerts, performances and public events, including stage rigging, full catering kitchen and cooking capability, additional dressing rooms for performers and related offices

Ground was broken on the state-of-the-art Foster Pavilion on May 2, 2022, with the playing floor installed on November 6, 2023. The inaugural men's basketball game came against Cornell on Tuesday, January 2, 2024, with BU winning 98-79. The inaugural women's basketball game was played on Wednesday, January 3, 2024, against TCU, BU winning 71-50.

TEAM NOTES

- Baylor is 279-2 all-time when shooting 50 percent or better from the field and 40-0 when shooting 60 percent or higher. The Bears' last loss when shooting over 50 percent was to No. 22 Michigan on 11/27/22.
- 388 of Baylor's wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 28 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points.
- Since the 2010-11 season, Baylor is 51-12 vs. Top 25 opponents at home.
- Baylor is 373-117 (.761) vs. Big 12 opponents in the regular season all-time.

THE BAYLOR BEARS REGIME

2019 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2018-19 Bears became just the third women's program in NCAA history to win three titles when Baylor beat Notre Dame, 82-81, April 7 in Tampa, Florida. **Chloe Jackson's** go-ahead scoop layup with under five seconds left propelled her to NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player honors to go along with a team-high 26 points in the game. The Bears rode the wave of two All-American posts with **Kalani Brown** and **Lauren Cox**, each earning multiple all-America honors. The pair led Baylor to its 10th regular-season and tournament championship in the Big 12 and **Kim Mulkey** was honored as national coach of the year by the USBWA, the Associated Press and the WBCA.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2011-12 Bear season was as perfect as it could be. En route to claiming its second NCAA Championship in seven years, Baylor ran the table, posting an unprecedented 40-0 mark and claiming both Big 12 Conference crowns. **Brittney Griner** and Mulkey swept player of the year and coach of the year honors, earning WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, Naismith and Big 12 Conference recognition. Baylor was ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire in both polls and raced through conference play with a Big 12-record 18-0 mark. Griner and **Odyssey Sims** were named consensus All-Americans, while **Destiny Williams** was a WBCA All-America honorable mention honoree.

2005 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The squad posted a 33-3 record and claimed the Big 12 Conference title with a 14-2 mark. En route to the program's first NCAA Championship, the Bears defeated three No. 1 seeds. **Steffanie Blackmon** and **Sophia Young** were both named All-Americans. In addition to earning Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, **Mulkey** received the New York Athletic Club's prestigious Winged Foot Award.

NCAA TOURNAMENT STAPLE

The Bears have made 21-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 23 overall. Those appearances have resulted in three national championships (2005, 2012, 2019), four Final Fours (2005, 2010, 2012, 2019), 10 Elite Eights and 16 Sweet Sixteens.

BIG 12 DYNASTY

- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 24 Big 12 Conference titles -- 13 regular season and 11 tournament championships.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference four times (2012, 2013, 2018, 2019). It has only happened six times in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in 2010).
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game 16 times in program history.
- The Bears have won six of the last 12 Big 12 Championship titles, last besting No. 17/20 West Virginia, 76-50, in the 2021 final.
