**Equestrian**

- EQ opens its spring championship season on Thursday, hosting No. 3 South Carolina at 12 p.m. at the Willis Family Equestrian Center.
- The Bears went 1-5 in the fall, including 1-2 in the Big 12 Conference.
- The highlight of the fall came on Oct. 31 in a 12-5 win over No. 6 Fresno State.
- The spring opener starts a three-meet homestand for the Bears, also hosting Oklahoma State on Feb. 6 and TCU on Feb. 21.

**Men's Basketball**

- MBB fell in a pair of home games last week, suffering a 92-73 loss vs. No. 12/12 Texas Tech on Tuesday, before falling 97-90 vs. TCU on Saturday.
- The Bears fell behind courtesy of a 31-11 run by TCU in the second half, breaking open a 38-38 game at halftime and couldn't overcome the hole to complete the comeback.
- Baylor hits the road for a two-game road swing through Ohio and West Virginia, facing Cincinnati on Wednesday before facing WVU on Saturday in Morgantown.
- Cameron Carr leads the Bears with 20.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per game, while freshman Tounde Yessooufou averages 17.7 points and 5.9 rebounds per game.

**Men's Tennis**

- No. 19 MT had its matchup with SMU postponed due to inclement weather, as the two teams - the co-hosts of the 2026 ITA Indoor National Championships - were set to face off on ITA Kickoff Weekend. Both teams receive byes to the Indoor Nationals as a result of hosting.
- The Bears will now host Tulsa on Friday at 6 p.m. at Hawkins Indoor, travel to face TCU on Feb. 5 and host Texas A&M on Feb. 9, before hosting the ITA Indoor Nationals on Feb. 13-15.

**Track & Field**

- Baylor recorded 27 top-eight finishes at Texas A&M's annual Ted Nelson Invitational over the weekend in College Station.
- The Bears were highlighted by junior All-American Molly Haywood's 15-foot pole vault, just the third 15-foot indoor pole vault in program history.
- Baylor hits the road for the DeLoss Dodds Invitational in Manhattan, Kan., on Friday and Saturday.

**Women's Basketball**

- No. 14 WBB stretched its winning streak to eight straight with a pair of resounding wins in Big 12 play, staying in a tie for first place.
- The Bears improved to 12-1 at Foster Pavilion and rolled past UCF (73-48) and Houston (82-66) during the week. BU owns a NET ranking of No. 26.
- Baylor now faces a pair of road tests, including No. 22 West Virginia on Sunday at 12 p.m. CT on ESPN, and Cincinnati on Wednesday in the Queen City.
- Taliah Scott continues to state her case for Big 12 Player of the Year, averaging 20.3 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. Darianna Littlepage-Buggs averages 10.9 points and 10.9 rebounds per game, while Bella Fontleroy sports 9.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game.

**Women's Golf**

- No. 21 WG opened its spring season with a fourth-place finish at the PDI Intercollegiate in Orlando last week. It was BU's sixth straight top-five finish.
- The Bears were led by sophomore Malena Castro and freshman Amelia Wan each firing 66s en route to top-10 finishes. Bridget Boczar had a four-under 68 on Monday and finished tied for 14th.
- Baylor ventures to Tucson, Ariz., for the Arizona Thunderbird Intercollegiate on Feb. 9-10.

**Women's Tennis**

- Weather thwarted No. 25 WT's bid at advancing to the ITA Indoor Nationals, as Baylor withdrew from Kickoff Weekend in Austin, which featured a four-team field that included Cal, Texas and Arizona.
- Baylor now returns to action on Sunday, hosting SMU at Hawkins Indoor, before welcoming Rice on Feb. 6 and Washington on Feb. 8.
